75 nonprofit corporations recognized by the Conferences and General Synod of the United Church of Christ, encompassing 417 facilities and programs. Collectively we provide:

- Affordable Housing: 302
- Services to the Aging: 82
- Services to Children, Youth and Families: 20
- Transitional and Shelter Care: 7
- Primary and Acute Health Services: 3
- Services to Persons with Disabilities: 2
- Charitable Grant Making Foundations: 1

2022 Service Statistics

- Operated 21,506 affordable housing units
- Operated facilities with 6,065 beds providing acute & skilled nursing care
- For older adults, operated 10,237 independent and 3,301 assisted living units
- Provided community-based ambulatory health care to over 2.2 million people
- Cared for 26,509 children and youth in residential & non-residential programs
- Provided residential & non-residential services to 350+ with developmental disabilities
- Provided 198,295 hours of volunteer service
- Provided over \$1 billion in uncompensated & charitable care
- Received \$62.5 million in charitable contributions




Resurrected Community Development Corporation addresses systemic issues in the Allentown, PA, community related to racism and poverty including unemployment and educational disparities.

Obtained Pennsylvania Department of Human Services approved childcare provider license. Partnered with Resurrected Life Community Church to hold annual Back to School Bash for children, youth, and families in Allentown

RLCA Staff/Parent Success Story... A staff member who is also a parent of six children (all of whom went through the Academy), was given help to fix her credit and was able to apply for Habitat for Humanity. She is now going to be a homeowner and continue her education





Operating Revenues 2022




Operating Expenses 2022




